Reaching out to veterans all over East Lancashire

VETERANS and their families in Burnley now have the opportunity to meet with members of VIC on a regular basis.

As part of VIC extending its services throughout East Lancashire, the Burnley weekly outreach and activity session began on August 20 at the Retreat 'N' Recovery Centre at 21 Hammerton Street in the town centre (pictured).

Drop-in sessions are now being held every Tuesday from 10am - 2pm.

Project co-ordinator Andrea Goodall said: "We are moving forward with expanding the successful model we have developed in Rossendale and tailoring it to meet the needs of the different areas in East Lancashire. The response



are doing has been phenomenal."

VIC is also one of the founding members of the Pendle Armed Forces Covenant Group, has been supporting the development of the group.

This has included building the group's membership ensuring that all main Veteran support agencies operating in Pendle are invited, the development of the constitution and terms of reference.

Executive Director Diane Owen is currently the Chairperson and VIC is working with members to find suitable premises in Nelson to host a 'one stop shop'.

The VIC outreach team in Hyndburn is set to go, with activities lead by Dave Goss and Graham Gilsenan with Sean Clarke leading on employability.

VIC is currently looking for a suitable premises to offer an outreach and a model making group, supported by Lancashire Care Foundation Trust who are offering a new coping skills support package. VIC's partner REAL was successful in securing £80,000 from the NHS East Lancashire Clinical Commissioning Group to enable VIC to provide services across the area. An update on progress so far was delivered by members of VIC to locality groups in Hyndburn, Pendle and Rossendale.

At the same time comprehensive information packs were given to all GPs and Practice Managers and an offer of one-to-one training regarding veterans issues was made.

And soon VIC representatives and information will be on public information vehicle Stan the Van in the Ribble Valley. The schedule will be on our website.

A HOMELESS veteran was found accommodation in just a day when he called into the 'Pop-up' shop in Bury.

The young homeless ex-soldier called into the shop and VIC members provided outreach support to assist him in being rehoused.

VIC family support worker Suzanne Preston said: "The young man came into

the shop and he just got talking. That was when he explained his situation.

"He was not a strong enough person to be able to fight for his rights, but members of VIC were only too happy to help him out.

"We went with him to the authorities and, within a day, he had accommodation. Before we closed the shop, he called back in to thank everyone for helping him solve his problems.

"In turn we would like to thank Work Solutions and Bury Council housing team for going the extra mile and the members of the Fusilier Association Lancashire.
