

Battlefields tour planned Marshal for D-Day anniversary

A SPECIAL 80th anniversary of D-Day tour of the battlefields is being planned by VIC for June 2024.

10 YEARS

The road trip will visit Normandv in France, where the troops landed on the beaches, and travel to The Somme along with other First World War sites Operations

Manager Bob Elliott said: "The initial plan, at the moment, is to leave from Portsmouth and sail to Le Havre, spend

two nights around Caen and visit the D-Day sites.

"On the third night, we will stay around Amiens and visit The Somme areas and then we plan to finish at the Menin Gate to hear The Last Post.

"We have not vet decided whether to stay another night. we will then travel back from Calais."

The cost has been estimated at around £400 per person and a minimum of eight or nine people is needed.

Ideally, 11 would mean the trip maximises the capacity of the minibus and would give as many people as possible the opportunity to attend.

Bob said: "We understand that with the cost of living at the moment and everybody is struggling financially, and this is why we have decided to put it back to June next year to allow those wanting to join us chance to save the money.

"We will set up a

system where you can pay monthly to ease the costs once we have confirmed those who want to join the trip."

Accommodation will be either on campsites, AirBnB or combination of both. These costs will be included. along with breakfast and an evening meal

Progress made on VPPP AS PARTNERS in the multi-agency Veterans' Places. Pathwavs and People, VPPP, VIC is working to assist the **Armed Forces** community in Preston. Last January we were

selected to be a part of delivering the VPPP - an Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust programme.

Nationally, £9million has been awarded to the programme which is being delivered by four national strategic projects and a further 10 regional projects.

In the North West. Broughton House, in Salford, is the portfolio lead and the Armed Forces HQ at Wigan is managing the programme.

It was at Wigan that partners met up to discuss



the next steps and VIC was represented by Operations Manager Bob Elliott and Chief Executive Amanda Walton.

Amanda said: "We will be assisting others to set up social hubs and developing a social prescribing toolkit to help veterans.

"We have been contacted by David Waters, President of Central Armed Forces Veterans' Association, in Preston. There are very few

local facilities in the Central Lancashire area, but there is still a need.

"He wanted to do something about this and contacted Project Manager for Lancashire Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust lan Barber who put us in touch.

"We have agreed to help and support him to set up ongoing welfare and advice support to veterans in that area."

This year was our 10th anniversary and a very special year for us, some veterans charities and organisations were greatly affected by the pandemic, but VIC came through stronger as we were able to plan and adapt to the 'new way of working'.

ACTIVITIES

Each week, more than 80 people attended the activities at VIC outreach venues in Accrington, Clitheroe. Haslingden, Heywood and Middleton. These include: art and craft groups, social trips, walks, model railway club and Choir. Each month, the VIC Centre had an average of 112 members, partner organisations and drop-in's.

VIP VISIT

In January, Retired Colonel David Richmond CBE, an Independent Advisor to the UK Government, visited the VIC Centre. He wanted to learn more about the charity and the work that VIC does and he chatted to several veterans.

BREAKFAST

Accrington Stanley Community Trust held its first Veterans' Breakfast Club at Carers Link Accrington. VIC is supporting this new initiative and Project Worker Ray Sharkey worked closely with Lee from the Trust to get this open.

FILM-MAKING

We started filming

the 'The Stories In Transition' project in February. VIC members Darren Horsnell, Steve Butterworth, Dave Joddrell and some of our members were involved in the filming process and were interviewed.

This year our outreach team held a number of information stands across our operating areas.

We took another young person on work experience from North Lancs Training. He learnt social and general building maintenance skills and found employment.

Our CEO and Ops Manager attended the two-day ASDIC conference in Leeds. It was a great opportunity to meet other Veteran Drop-In Services around the UK and hear about the work being done to support the Armed Forces Community.

JUBILEE

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations were held for Queen Elizabeth II, in all VIC locations. In Haslingden an original 14ft-long Coronation Banner from 1953 was hung outside the centre.

We had stands at the Amazing Accrington Food Festival and War Re-enactment Day in June, at Burnley's first Uniform Services Family Fun Day, and Preston Military Show.
