Arts and Crafts Co-ordinator Darren discovered the therapeutic properties of art while he was recuperating at Combat Stress after serving in the Falklands Conflict.

He has been running art classes at VIC Centre in Bury Road and also, through the Creative Community Hub, at Jubilee Court in Haslingden. Several residents from Jubilee Court attended the shop's opening.

Darren said: "This all stems from when I first started art therapy and I realised what art can do for you and how much therapy you can



get out of it.

"It took me two years before I went along to art therapy and then when I did I couldn't believe how it affected me.

"I would open up while I was painting and I started to talk about my experiences through my art, not verbal.

"Then I started getting people coming to me asking me for advice and it gave me a buzz. It is better than any medication."

Darren, along with volunteers from the arts and crafts group at VIC, will be manning the shop. It is also planned to run workshops in the future.

The shop was officially opened by the Mayor of

VIC members were among special guests of Rossendale School in Turn Village at a service of dedication and thanksgiving for the men and women of Rossendale who gave their lives during the First and Second World Wars.

The Rev Hugh Bearn, Chaplain to the Queen, conducted the service and former Rossendale MP Sir David Trippier was guest speaker.

Other guests included Jake Berry, Rossendale and Darwen MP, the Mayors of Rossendale and Bolton, school governors, staff and pupils from Rossendale School.

A memorial Stone was laid in the grounds.

The pupils had researched two local brothers who died during the First World War and this was the inspiration that led to the tribute.

Garden's coming up roses

OUR back yard will soon be 'blooming' lovely thanks to the hard work of veterans and the generosity of a number of groups.

We secured nearly £10,000 from Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale Council for Voluntary Service, which administers the Social Prescribing Grant for the East Lancashire Clinical Commissioning Group.



That money was used to develop the rear yard into an area to plant and grow crops and flowers with a workshop where veterans can learn new skills and create garden items to sell.

Manager Bob Elliott said: "We have had a donation from Edgeside Baptist Church of plants, shrubs and vegetables and we have also had a lot of help from fellow veterans' charity Dig In North West.

"We have created a memorial at the rear of the building, which we have planted out and when the flowers bloom it will spell out VIC.

"We also have fruit, veg and herbs growing and it would be nice for us to have a celebration event to say thank you to everyone who has donated and helped."
