Grants guarantee VIC services

TWO grants have secured the services of VIC across East Lancashire and the Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale areas for another year.

Both grants have also been increased, which is an endorsement of the amazing work VIC is carrying out to support ex-service personnel.

The East Lancashire NHS Clinical Commissioning Group has supported the work of VIC since its inception in 2012 and has



now increased its grant by £10,000 to £90,000.

A further grant from Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale Clinical Commissioning Group has been increased four-fold from £5,000 to £21,302 to support the work VIC has been carrying out.

Chief Executive Liz Hamilton, *pictured*, said: "We are delighted with the continued support that VIC has received from both funding bodies.

"The East Lancashire money will now see further outreach services introduced into Hyndburn and Ribble Valley and inter-generational work will also be carried out with the Army Cadets in

Haslingden."

In the HMR area the increased funding will enable further ex-service personnel to be identified, allow them to be supported and gain access to statutory services with the aim of reducing isolation and encouraging integration.

Liz added: "We will be working with other agencies and organisations to deliver on these contracts including integrated NHS neighbourhood teams, The Royal British Legion and Link4Life."



OUR allotment, off Holcombe Road, Helmshore, is being prepared ready for planting.

The work will be a continuation of our successful Dig for VIC that started last year where we grew crops in the rear yard of the VIC Centre and led to a delicious harvest.

THE doors of the VIC Centre will be open during Easter as part of our Open All Hours project.

We received a grant worth nearly £20,000 to fund activities during holiday periods, as these are often a time when veterans feel particularly lonely.

The grant, from the Armed Forces Covenant, paid for activities over Christmas and New Year

and during Easter the centre will be open three days.

The centre will be open Good Friday from 10am to 3pm; open Easter Saturday for a Bob Ross art class at 10.30am; closed Easter Sunday; open Easter Monday from 10am to 3pm.

There will be a Wii sports tournament, board games and films to watch. Refreshments will be served and cakes have been generously donated by Park Bakery in Oldham.

New admin Tracy has 'come home'

HAVING served six years in the 5th Royal Regiment of the Fusiliers Territorial Army, Tracy Keir is well placed to take on her new role as our administrative assistant.

She has also worked as PA to the Captain at the MoD in Bury and was used to handling requests from TA soldiers to serve with the army overseas.

At one stage she also inspected army bases in Germany to check on the standard of early years' provision.

Tracy, from Bacup, said: "I did my training at Guildford alongside regular soldiers



and when I trained both men and women undertook exactly the same training regime, it has all changed now. "Because the Fusiliers are an infantry regiment we did a lot of tabbing, quick marching through all different kinds of terrain.

"I heard about this job by accident because a friend was going for it. I feel like I have come home because I am used to working in the MoD office; this was my ideal job."

Tracy is married to Rob, whom she met in the TA, he went on to serve in the RAF and retired as Squadron Leader three years ago. Their son Tom serves in the Merchant Navy and their daughter Ellie is at Haslingden High School.

Community reporters make the grade

WE NOW have three trained community reporters in VIC working with veterans.

Outreach worker Tony Stubbs, Warren Beman and lain Barrow have been trained as part of pilot project Overcoming Barriers that VIC is involved with in the Greater Manchester area. Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "They are now trained to interview veterans about their experiences and problems with accessing mental health services in the NHS

"Two films have already been made, one to show to providers and the second to show to other veterans. "They will also be filming the activities we carry out at VIC."

As a result of their involvement in the project, Warren and Tony have also been asked to continue in their role as community reporters. If it is successful, the pilot may be extended to other areas of the country.


Mark's dive update
